## EMERGENCY PROCEDURE

### A) ACCIDENT TO A BIKER IN A GROUP

The unharmed bikers must make an initial assessment of the condition of the victim, and, depending on the seriousness of the biker's condition, must call Blu Bike staff on (telephone number 0192076216), or call the medical emergency service on 112 for help with the rescue.

When contacting 112, stay calm and restrict yourself to answering the operator's questions. Blu Bike staff must be alerted to the incident in every case.

Attention: The procedures for assessment and communication are the exclusive responsibility of the uninjured bikers).

### B) ACCIDENT TO A SOLO BIKER

If the victim is able to communicate, they should follow the procedure in point A above.

If the biker cannot communicate, it is the responsibility of the next biker to arrive to follow the procedure in point A above.

### C) ASSISTANCE AT THE ACCIDENT SITE

There are xx control posts on the course to help with communications and provide assistance.

The protocol for providing assistance is as follows:

1) When a request for assistance has been received, there will be an initial assessment of the situation using the available information. This includes the effect on the race, how many people are injured and what their condition might be. Based on this, the rescue team will decide what needs to be done.

2) In relation to the estimated condition of those affected, and co-ordinating with the assistance of the rescue team, Blu Bike will use the fastest way to get to the accident site.

3) In certain situations related to the weather and the condition of the terrain, or in particularly difficult circumstances, the procedure outlined here may be supplemented by additional measures.
